

**INFORMED SUPERVISION** Preparation for, and review of proposed spending budgets, grant applications, resolutions, policies or agreements is imperative before important votes.

**MORE PUBLIC ACCESS** Move Supervisor board meetings back to 5:30pm. The technology is in place to webcast and archive county meetings.

**PROPERTY RIGHTS** Spot zoning for future mega sites is being proposed and will require changes to language in the Comprehensive Plan. Any economic development that is subsidized by tax payers must have defined and measured incentives.

**ACCOUNTABLE BONDING** County taxpayers were saddled with \$10M in 911 consolidated dispatch debt, without a referendum. Supervisors must enforce performance from SECC911 through their representative on the five member Board.

**FISCAL SOBRIETY** County taxes collected and spent have doubled in fourteen years with only 5% population increase. End no bid contracts, vague resolutions, uncapped levies and watchdog intergovernmental agreements.

**TAXES 101** A lower levy does not always equal lower taxes. Taxpayers deserve full disclosure of who owns which increases on your tax bill.
